Phonics/Read Write Inc.

This will take you to the Oxford University Press website. In this 'Learning at Home' section is a 'Guide for parents'. Depending on the 'set' your child is in for Read Write Inc, please click on the red resources link e.g. Set 1 Resources, Set 2 Resources or Set 3 Resources. This will take you to a Speed Sounds book. On the inside cover of the book are notes to parents and carers on how to use the book. There is also a sound pronunciation guide link here.

Set 1- Please learn and practise the handwriting for the next four sounds in the book. These are: 'u' 'b' 'f' and 'e'. It is incredibly important that your child forms each letter in the correct way so please look at the handwriting sheets carefully as they show you where to start with the letter formation. Again, once your child has learnt the four sounds for the week, give them the below spelling test. They get one point for each word spelt correctly, and an additional point for every letter formed correctly – they must have started the letter formation at the correct point. The children do not need to join their handwriting and should **not** be using the lead in stroke e.g. hello. Remember to encourage your child to use their 'Fred fingers' and 'Fred talk' when spelling out the words.

Set 2/3- Please learn the following sounds in the book and also Fred Talk the linked words. The sounds for this week are: 'ea' 'oi' 'a-e' and 'i-e'. Once your child has learnt the four sounds for the week, give them the below spelling test. They get one point for each word spelt correctly, and an additional point for every letter formed correctly – they must have started the letter formation at the correct point. If you need support on how to form each letter, please have a look at the **Set 1** book as this has letter formation within it. The children do not need to join their handwriting and should **not** be using the lead in stroke e.g. hello. Remember to encourage your child to use their 'Fred fingers' and 'Fred talk' when spelling out the words.

If you are in Blue group or Grey group, please choose your two favourite grey books to reread!

Maths

This week, please complete the following activities:

- 1. Number bonds bingo. Choose if you would like to work on number bonds to 10, or 20. Choose 6 numbers between 1-10, or 1-20 and write them down. The bingo master must then call out a number, and if you have the matching number to make it up to 10 or 20, you can cross it out! First to cross all their numbers out wins.
- 2. Get measuring! If you have a ruler or a tape-measure use this and measure in CM. If you can't find a ruler or tape-measure, you can use your hand span! Go around your home and measure these items, or make your own list of items to measure.
- A sofa
- A book
- A cushion
- A window
- A door

You can record and then compare the measurements, and talk about which one is longer, or shorter.

3. Number formation. This week please practise writing both the numbers and words up to 20!
