

### Year 1 Ver Home Learning for the Week Beginning 27th April 2020

#### Phonics/Read Write Inc.

To continue supporting the children at home, Read Write Inc. are posting **daily** videos on YouTube. In these videos, there is a trained Read Write Inc. teacher delivering a phonics lesson for the children to follow along with. Please make sure that you are still watching these daily videos for the correct set of sounds that your child is learning. There will be a new sound published each day per set so please ensure that they are doing this every day and continue this for the foreseeable future. If you search Read Write Inc on youtube, the daily video should become available.

Also attached to this document are 3 new work sheets where the children can practise their sounds. These sounds are 'or', 'ou' and 'oo'. For each word, please ensure the children find the 'Special Friends', 'Fred Talk' the word and then say the word.

Continue to play these Fred games around the house. Examples of games are below:

- 'Fred talk eye-spy', e.g. I spy with my little eye a 'h' 'ou' 'se'. Your child should then say 'house'.
- 'Fred Says' (like Simon Says) e.g. Put your hands on your 'h' 'ea' 'd'. Your child should then say 'head' and put their hands on their head!
- 'Fred word hunt' choose a word with a sound that you have learnt in it. For example, for the sound 'ay' you might choose the word 'play'. Write each sound that makes up the word on separate pieces of paper, so 'p', 'l' and "ay' would be written on separate pieces of paper. Hide these pieces of paper around the house. Then give the children clues to where you have hidden the bits of paper using Fred Talk. E.g. the first sound is underneath the 'ch' 'air', and the children will say 'chair' and go to search underneath the chair for the first sound. Repeat this until they have found all of the sounds to complete the word! You can do this with as many words as you like, using the sounds that the children have been learning.

#### And here is a new Fred game for this week!

Collect 3-4 objects from around your house. Gather these in front of you and let the children see the items. Then, cover them all with a tea-towel or something similar. While the objects are hidden, take one away and hide it. Next, show the children the objects again and see if they can guess which item you took away while they were covered. When guessing the item they think has been taken away, the children should use Fred-talk e.g. "You have taken the s p oo n". Repeat this several times taking away the different items each time!

Also continue to use Fred talk around the house, e.g. it's time for 'l' 'u' 'n' 'ch' (lunch).

If you are in Grey group, please read 'Clothes' and 'Mythical monsters'

### Writing & Craft

This week, we would like you to write a list of all the things you would put in the basket if you were making the lighthouse keepers yummy lunch. What would you put in the sandwiches? What drink would you give him? You can put as many things in the lunch as you like. You can also draw the lunch or make the lunch if you have the ingredients. The children will be able to watch videos on MyMaths that teach them the skills needed to complete the tasks.

Please also continue to practise number formation.
