Other Tasks/Challenges

You may choose to do all, or just a selection, of the following:

1) Create a fact file about a famous Pirate. Some of the information you could include could be;

- Their real name and pirate name.
- When were they born, How did they die?
- Why did they become a Pirate?
- Distinguishing features.
- Where were they active and how long for?
- What was the name of their ship?
- Did they have their own pirate flag?

What else can you find out about them?

2) If you were a Pirate what would your pirate name be and what would be the name of your ship? Design your own personal pirate flag (look up the meanings of prate flag symbols) and draw a picture of your ship flying your flag.

3) Art Challenge: Create an authentic looking treasure map. You can make paper look old by carefully tearing edges and staining it with wet tea bags and coffee granules. When the paper is dry you can set about creating your map. You could write a set of instructions to get to the treasure instead of an X to mark the spot. Don't forget to show a compass to indicate north (NB It doesn't have to be straight up.)

4) Use the attached map. Label all the continents and oceans. Mark in the equator, Tropic of Cancer and Tropic of Capricorn. Where can the doldrums be found and what happens to ships here? Where was the Spanish Main? Can you find out where the 6 following pirate strongholds were and label them: Port Royal, St Mary's Island, Tortuga, Clew Bay, New Providence and Baratavia Bay.
