Transitions

Transitions are important for children whether starting nursery, moving up to the next room or moving on to school. These periods of change can provide exciting opportunities and new challenges for them. From experience, we know the way such transitions are handled can have a significant impact on children, in both the short and long term, accelerating progress but, more often, hindering it when children and the new provider are unprepared.

Working in Partnership with parents and the new setting will ensure children are supported effectively to develop confidence, manage their feelings, behaviour and understand the changes they will experience.

Effective transitions are crucial at all times but during the Covid 19 Pandemic children have already experienced an unsettled period that would usually have been a consistent. We need to work in a joined up, cohesive approach to ensure the wellbeing of our children and families is prioritised.
